AGM 2026 – Motions

Motions

- There are two motions put forward in accordance with AGM rules

- **Motion One**

Members are asked to approve the motion for CAMC Norfolk Centre rule number 3 - “Separate pup tents are allowed provided that they are pitched as directed by the marshals” be amended to

“One two-man pup tent is permitted within the pitch area of the outfit and this provision remains the responsibility of the Centre and the rally Officer (with CAMC guidance applicable).” As proposed by Mr Ian Lindsay and seconded by Mr Dominico Zagni.

- **Motion Two**

Members are asked to approve the motion “The Centre permits the use of tents and this provision remains the choice of the Centre and the Rally Officer (with CAMC guidance applicable).” As proposed by Mrs Sandra Lindsay and seconded by Mr Dominico Zagni.



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- To explain
- The Club holds two exemption certificates



The touring caravan exemption certificate includes:

- motorhomes,
- rooftop tents & small pup tents.



The camping exemption certificate covers:

- Tents and trailers.



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From CAMC Centre Guidance Handbook version 2025

- ii. **Trailer Tents and Roof Top Tents**

- Both are permitted as forms of accommodation. If trailer tents and rooftop tents are on-site, then they must adhere to the six-metre spacing rule, and it might be advisable to site them together at the venue.

- iii. **Tents (not trailer tents)**

- Pup tents are allowed on all rally fields and they must be pitched within the pitch area of the outfit. Centres that choose not to allow pup tents at a rally must clearly state this in rally publications, on the Centre website and at the point of booking.

- Other types of tents are allowed on rallies - Short and Long Rallies. If Centres choose not to allow tents at a rally they must clearly state this in rally publications, on the Centre website and at the point of booking.

- Tents must be grouped and sited in a separate area to motorised outfits and adhere to spacing requirements.

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Rally Sec Report - Centre Rules: Short & Long Rallies (d)

- i. Short Rallies (up to five days) These rallies are run following the Paragraph 6 exemption to the 1960 Act.
 - They must not be run beyond 120 hours/five days from the first outfit arriving to the last outfit leaving the rally field.
 - The Rally Officer, who is involved in the organisation of the rally, can arrive on site one night before and leave one night later - extending the 120-hour limit. However, this is a privilege and must be exercised sparingly. It applies to one outfit occupied by the Rally Officer and any other persons travelling with them in their outfit. Consecutive rallies on the same site are not permitted. A follow-on five-day rally organised by a Centre in the same area should be avoided, especially during popular holiday times/locations.
 - Tents are permitted on short, five-day rallies but only for members.
 - The administration of tents remains the responsibility of the organising Centre and Rally Officer, where a decision not to site tents may be made if the location is unsuitable or too difficult to manage. This must be communicated to members at the point of booking.





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- **Reasons for adopting the changes**

Motion one

- Effectively a change in the pup tent rule to stipulate only one pup tent to accommodate a maximum of two people per pitch.

Motion two

- – It follows the directive from the CAMC, which states there should be a good reason for not adopting the guidance
- – Provides a lower cost entry point for new members

- **Only clarification beyond the CAMC guidance**

- – CAMC Norfolk Centre rule number six stipulates "own sanitation must be provided".
